FACTS YOU MUST FACE

Life Is Short: "Man that is born of a woman is of few days, and full of trouble. He cometh forth like a flower, and is cut down: he fleeth also as a shadow, and continueth not" (Job 14:1-2). AM I REALLY A CHRISTIAN?

The story is told of the little boy who after coming home from Sunday services asked his dad, "Dad, what is a Christian?". After a few minutes of deliberation, he told his son that a Christian was one who faithfully followed the teachings of Christ; One who had learned the Bible, worshipped God regularly, worked to spread Christianity and gave sacrificially to the cause. The little boy thought about it for a minute or two and then asked, "Dad, have I ever seen one?".

The above little story indicates a truth that far too many "so called" Christians have yet to see. One can go around wearing the name "Christian" on his lips without ever being a Christian. The first time that the word "Christian" is found in our Bible is in Acts 11:26 where it says that "the disciples were called Christians first in Antioch". The dictionary defines the word "disciple" as, "One who subscribes to the teachings of a master and assists in spreading them" (The American Heritage Dictionary). There are three important points we wish to note from this definition.

The first and second we will combine. A Christian is one who subscribes to the teachings of Christ. One cannot subscribe to that which one does not know. Thus, it is required of one that would be a Christian that he or she learn those teachings of the Lord. The master in our definition is Christ. Having all authority (Matt. 28:18), a Christians will of necessity have to be obedient to Christ. Jesus Himself asked, "And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?" (Luke 6:46).

The third important point is that the disciple, thus the Christian must be assisting in spreading the teachings of their master, Christ. "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). Jesus said, "Every branch in me that beareth not fruit he taketh away..." (John 15:2).

Friend, just calling yourself a Christian does not make you one! Being a member of some institution that bears the name "Christian" makes neither the institution nor the members of that institution, Christians. It takes obedience to the truth of God's word to make real Christians. However, even for those who have obeyed the truth of God's word to become a true Christian, it takes continued obedience to God's word to remain pleasing in His sight. Examine yourself and see if you are really a Christian. *Tillis*
