## GOD'S WORD IS THE TRUTH

Jesus once told some Jews who believed on Him, "If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:31-32). If you know the word of the Lord, you know the truth, for the word of the Lord is the truth. In praying for His apostles, Jesus prayed, "Sanctify they through thy truth: thy word is truth" (John 17:17). Paul told the Thessalonians, "For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe" (I Thess. 2:13). Obviously, since the word of God is the truth and it is the truth that one must have to be set free from the bondage of sin, one ought to have a great desire to know that truth. In fact, Paul spoke of some that would perish, "...because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved" (II Thess. 2:10).

Though there are multitudes among us that could care less what God has to say, there are still enough to fill every football stadium, every race stand, every coliseum and every meeting house in America if they learned that the Lord was to appear at a certain time and speak to them in person. The Lord has spoken! One does not have to wait in line to enter a grand auditorium of some kind in order to hear God speak. Paul wrote, "But God hath revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea the deep things from God. For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God" (I Cor. 2:10-12). Later he told the Corinthians, "If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord" (I Cor. 14:37). God has spoken to us through His inspired prophets and apostles having revealed His will to physical Israel (through the prophets) and to Christians (through the apostles). Therefore, "All scripture is given by the inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works" (II Tim. 3:16-17).
